LOS ANGELES PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER NEWS

Fifty youth ages 9-18 years signed up for and attended a Pedals, Pipes, & Pizza event at Christ Cathedral in Garden Grove, on Tuesday, July 22. LA Chapter members Peter Bates and Joseph Simms hosted three different, successive youth working groups who assembled the LA Chapter's Orgelkids working pipe organ kit to the level where the organ--with its bellows, keyboard, and pipes--produced real organ music.

One young lady asked specifically about the purpose of the bellows. She received a brief demonstration where the bellows produced wind. Dr. Simms explained that an organ pipe needs wind to speak, just as one must blow wind through a flute or clarinet in the orchestra to make sounds.





At the invitation from David Ball, Christ Cathedral's Music Director, Joseph Simms as Director of the LA POE, highlighted events planned for next summer's POE. Several students and a few parents received POE brochures and some youngsters said they would not yet be 13 years old, but knew siblings, friends, and others with intermediate to advanced piano skills, or those already taking organ lessons.



Overview of the 2026 POE Schedule

After breakfast each morning, screened volunteer drivers will each take two students to their assigned church organ lesson sites, ten churches in all. Near the noon hour each day we will eat lunch at the Cathedral Center. Ten adult drivers and six adult chaperones will be needed from our LA AGO Chapter members.

On most afternoons, we will visit various churches and other sites for open console opportunities for the students to play prominent Los Angeles Area pipe organs. These will include Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angeles, First Congregational Church, a wondrous set of over 150 sample registrations from organs all over the world in an elegant private home, Occidental College Herrick Chapel, and the large concert-voiced instrument at Walt Disney Concert Hall which is home of the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the Los Angeles Master Chorale.

On Thursday afternoon we will visit a car museum which has a huge collection of large, working music boxes, an expanded range Bösendorfer concert grand piano, and a large theater organ. Los Angeles organists will play recitals on most other evenings.

On Thursday evening we will attend an orchestral concert at world-famous Hollywood Bowl. And Friday holds a practice time on a large instrument leading up to Saturday morning's POE student recital.

I am pleased to share more details about the AGO's inaugural Organ Study Tour to the Netherlands, taking place Feb. 22 – March 2, 2026. This exciting new initiative invites members to experience the country's rich and varied organ culture through guided visits, demonstrations, and opportunities to play some of the most significant historic instruments in the region.

Over the course of the week, we will visit a remarkable collection of organs representing a wide span of stylistic and historical periods, including Renaissance and Baroque masterpieces as well as instruments shaped by French symphonic and Romantic traditions. Notable highlights include Arp Schnitger's 1691 organ in the Martinikerk in Groningen and the 1738 Müller organ at the St.-Bavokerk in Haarlem. At each stop, local musicians will greet us with live demonstrations and offer insights into the instruments' history, construction, and musical significance.

In addition to guided tours and presentations, participants will have the unique opportunity to play several of the featured instruments, making this a hands-on, immersive experience that combines learning with performance.

We will also visit Orgelpark in Amsterdam, an international concert venue known for its exceptional collection of pipe organs from various eras and for its pioneering work in modern organ technology. A behind-the-scenes tour of Flentrop Orgelbouw, the renowned Dutch organ-building firm, will further enhance our understanding of the craftsmanship behind these majestic instruments.

Participants will follow along with a printed guidebook, which includes detailed information about the instruments, builders, and churches featured on the tour. This will serve as both a helpful reference during the journey and a souvenir keepsake afterward.

The tour will be based in Amsterdam, with time set aside for personal exploration of the city's museums, neighborhoods, and cuisine. Our travel partner, Peter's Way Tours, is coordinating hotel accommodations, local transportation, and a knowledgeable guide who will accompany us throughout the week. Please note that walking is an essential part of the tour, especially when visiting historic churches located along narrow streets that are not accessible by bus.

Registration is now open, and space is limited. Don't miss out on this one-of-a-kind opportunity to explore the Netherlands through the lens and sound of its magnificent organ heritage. The deadline to register is Sept. 1, 2025.

Plan to join us on Monday, Aug. 18 at 7 p.m. ET / 4 p.m. PT for a special live Zoom presentation. Director of Education Michelle Kardos and I will discuss the itinerary and instruments, and answer any questions you may still have about the trip.

Connie Grisham passed away peacefully in her sleep on May 11, 2025, in Lafayette, California. Born Constance Evelyn Telfer to Ralph and Evelyn Telfer, Connie grew up on a farm in Lafayette, Indiana, where she first discovered her lifelong love of music. A talented pianist and organist from a young age, she pursued her passion through her studies at the University of Evansville, Cal State Northridge, and Occidental College.

It was at the University of Evanville where she met her future husband and father of her children. In 1961, Connie moved to California, where she was soon married and began raising her family. She was the proud mother of three children: Geoffrey, Genesa, and Sherry. Connie dedicated over 40 years of her life to music, most notably as the organist and Director of Music at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Northridge and St. George's

Episcopal Church in La Cañada, California. Her work there was not only a career but a calling—one that enriched the spiritual and artistic lives of many. It was through this community that she met her beloved life partner, David Rennels, who joined the choir and shared in her deep love of music.

She was also a devoted member of the Los Angeles chapter of the American Guild of Organists, serving in various leadership roles. Beyond music, Connie was a passionate supporter of the arts, a curious and adventurous traveler, and a gifted cook who brought people together through her hospitality and warmth.

She is survived by her daughters Genesa Wagoner and Sherry Grisham; her cherished grandchildren Jasper Wagoner, Maya Wagoner, Violet Reed, and Estella Reed; and by the many friends, musicians, and parishioners whose lives she touched with grace, creativity, and compassion.


